Summary of fund objective

The objective of the Fund is to achieve long-term capital growth. The Fund intends to achieve its objective by investing primarily in a concentrated portfolio of global equities issued by companies that, in the view of the Investment Manager, are geared towards the growth of the Metaverse, which is underpinned by developments in Artificial Intelligence and thus help facilitate, create, or benefit from, immersive virtual worlds for both consumers and enterprises. 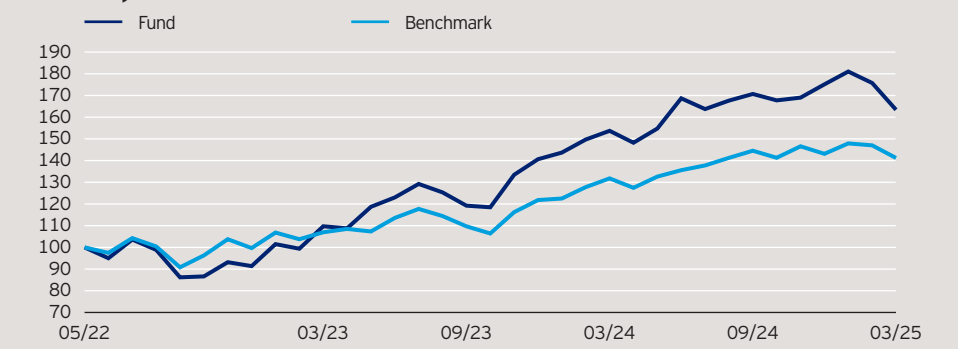

Fund Strategy

The fund seeks to invest in undervalued companies that help facilitate, create or benefit from the metaverse - a network of highly immersive virtual worlds for both consumers and enterprises. The fund managers take a fundamental approach to stock selection, with a focus on cash flow, balance sheet strength and business model sustainability. It will typically hold 30 to 50 stocks, diversified across the metaverse value chain.

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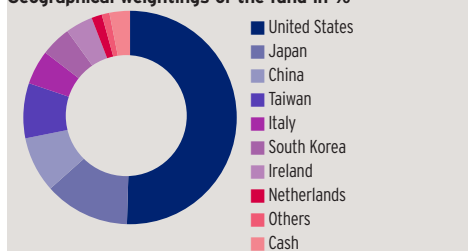

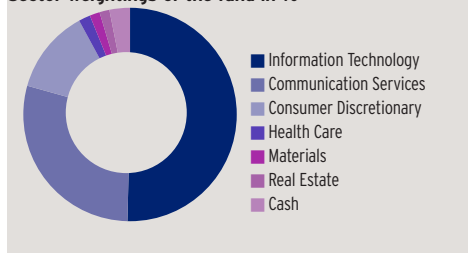

Exclusion Framework

The Fund embeds an exclusionary framework to specific activities based on UN Global Compact, severe governmental sanctions, revenue thresholds for certain activities linked to environmental and/or social criteria, as well as ensuring that companies follow good governance practices. The list of activities and their thresholds are listed below. The wording of international sanctions is something that we pay particular attention to as there are occasions where sanctions can exist in limited form, for example allowing investments in the secondary market. In addition to sanctions targeting entire countries, there are other thematic regimes, which may focus for example on human rights, cyber attacks, terrorist financing and corruption, which may apply to both individuals and/or entities/corporations.
